INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT (VARIATION)

- 1. The name of the school is Our Lady and St Joseph Catholic Voluntary Aided Primary School, Lymington.
- 2. The school was founded by and is part of the Catholic Church. The school is to be conducted as a Catholic School in accordance with the canon law and teachings of the Roman Catholic Church and in accordance with the Trust Deed of the Diocese of Portsmouth and in particular:
 - a) religious education is to be in accordance with the teachings, doctrines, disciplines and general and particular norms of the Catholic Church;
 - b) religious worship is to be in accordance with the rites, practices, discipline and liturgical norms of the Catholic Church;

and at all times the school is to serve as a witness to the Catholic faith in Our Lord Jesus Christ.

- 3. The school is a voluntary aided school
- 4. The name of the governing body is "The governing body of Our Lady and St Joseph Catholic Voluntary Aided Primary School, Lymington"
- 5. The governing body shall consist of:
 - a. SEVEN foundation governors
 - b. TWO parent governors
 - c. ONE staff
 - d. ONE headteacher
 - e. ONE local authority governor
- 6. The total number of governors shall be TWELVE
- 7. The Bishop of Portsmouth (or any other person exercising Ordinary jurisdiction on his behalf) shall have the right to appoint foundation governors.
- 8. This instrument of government comes into effect on 21 November 2013.

- 9. This instrument was made by order of Hampshire Local Authority on 24 September 2013
- 10. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the head teacher if not a governor), the Trustees in accordance with the Trust Deed and to the Director of Education of the Diocese of Portsmouth.
