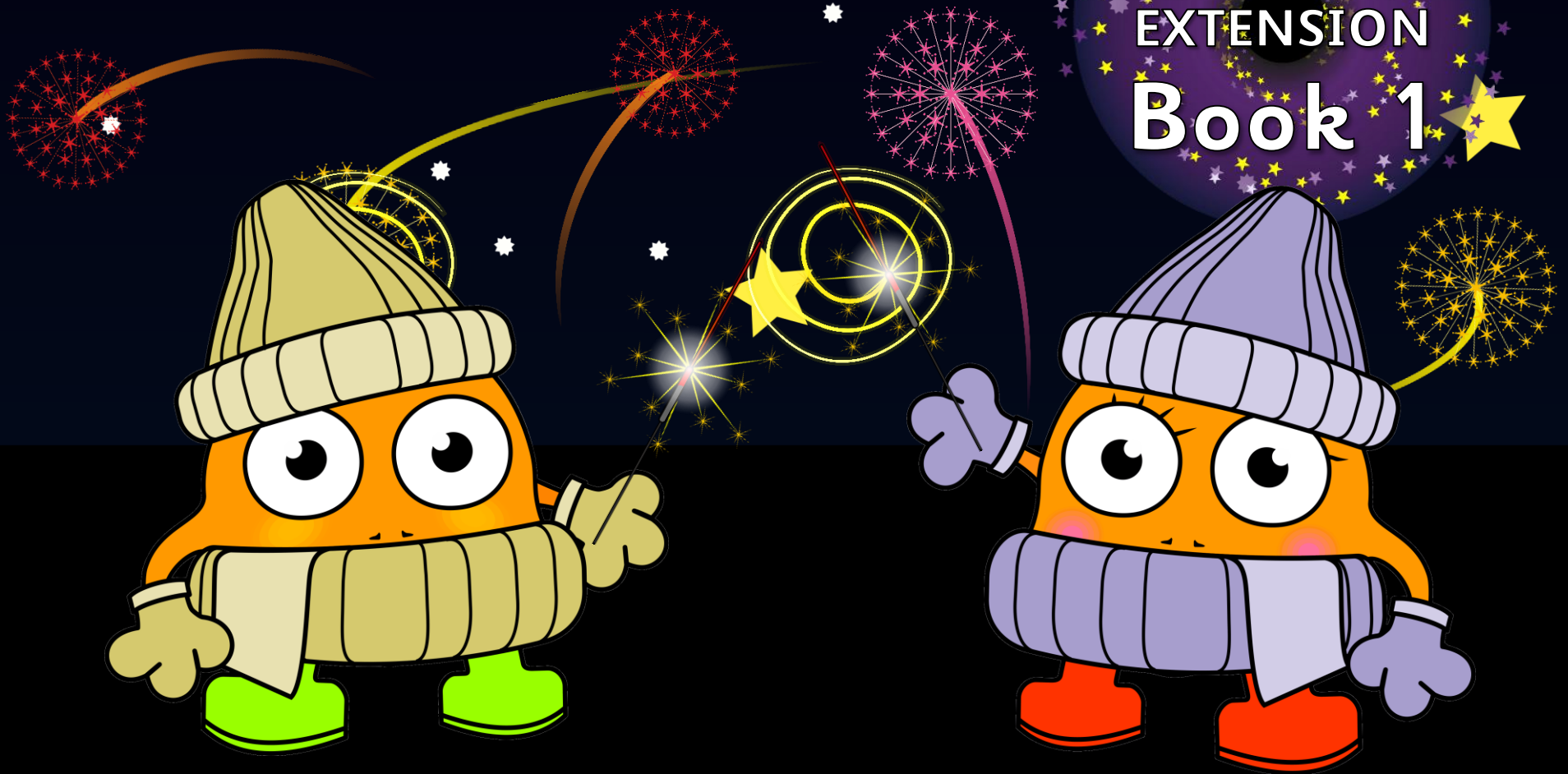


The Firework Show

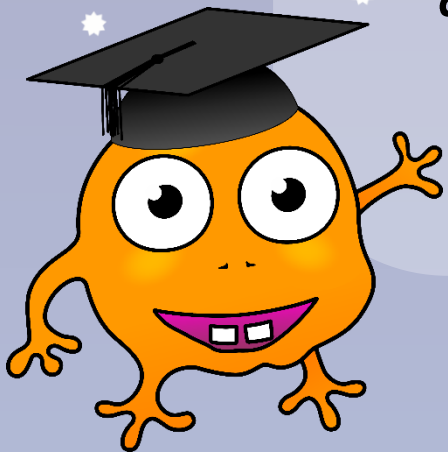

The Purple Phase “Extension” books are designed for pupils who have finished the original Pip and Pap Phonics programme of study.

Words indicated in purple, show words containing grapheme-phoneme correspondences from the final phase of study- the Purple Phase. Children need to confidently apply their phonics knowledge to read these words in a book with accuracy and fluency.

We therefore recommend that these books are used as “revision” or “assessment” books for competent and confident readers, as age appropriate texts for the end of Key Stage 1.

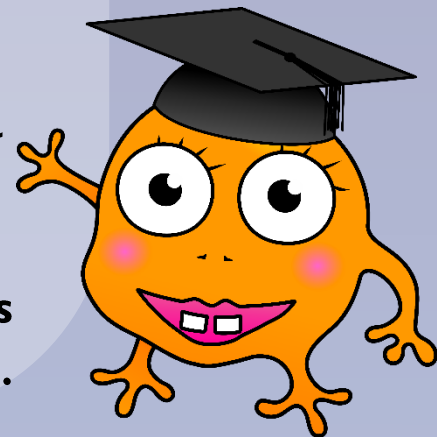


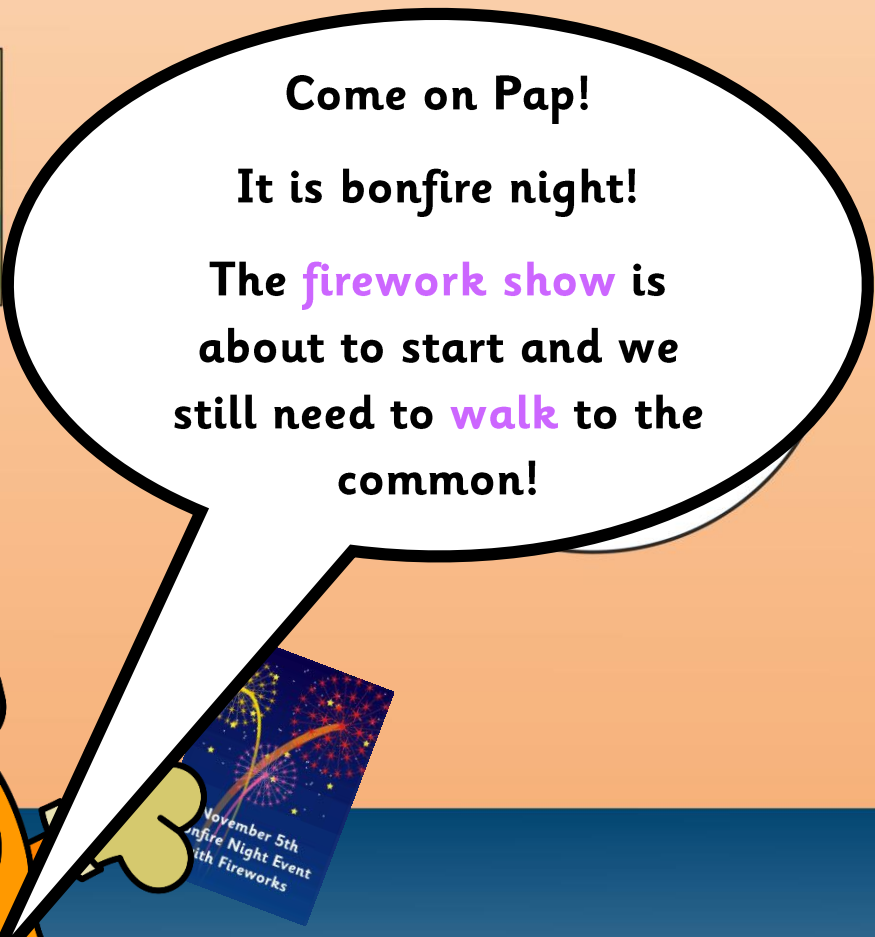
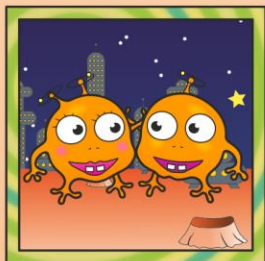
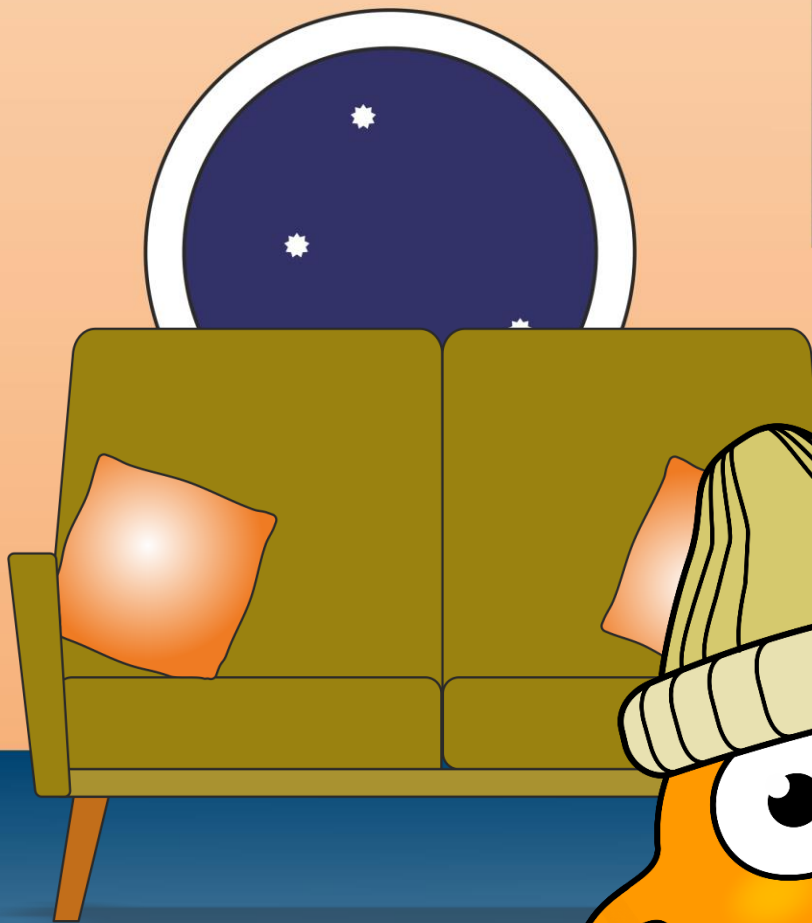
Pupils should be able to read all words in this book correctly (including those indicated in purple, where an alternative pronunciation may need to be applied to a known grapheme, or where the word contains an alternative spelling for a known phoneme.)

To show true fluency, a pupil should read with accuracy, automaticity and prosody, reading approximately 90 words a minute.

Additionally, they should also have a sound understanding of the events of the story and be comfortable with the vocabulary used in the book.

Pupils should be able to retell the tale in their own words, as well as being able to make inferences and predictions about the story, explaining their reasoning. They should be able to air their own opinions about the book. Some children may be able to make links between the characters and plot with other stories that they know.

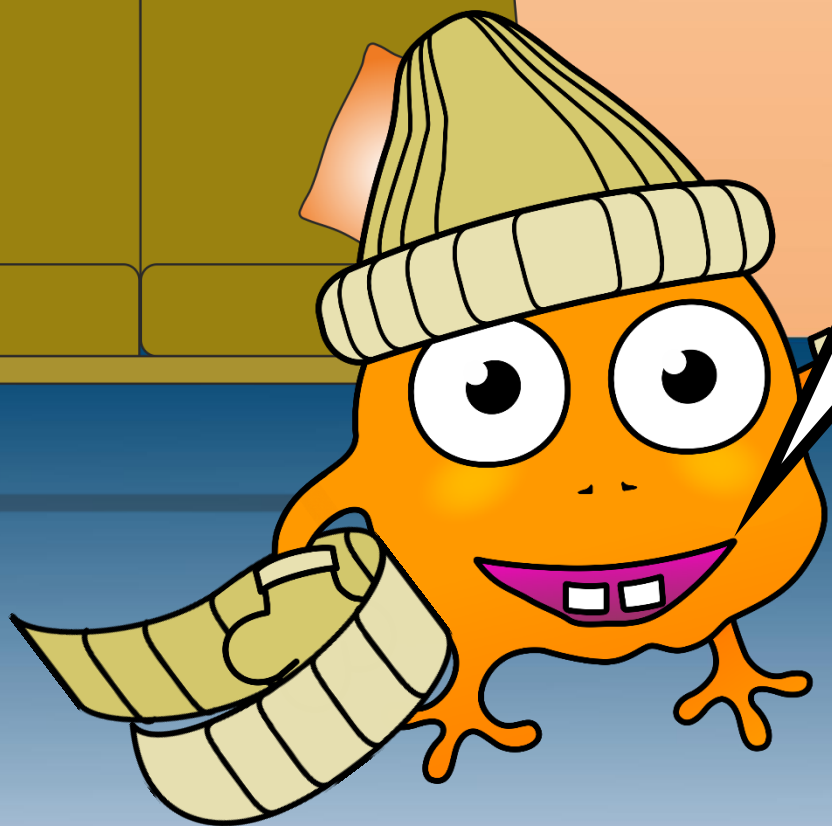




Come on Pap!

The **firework show** is about to start and we still need to **walk** to the common!



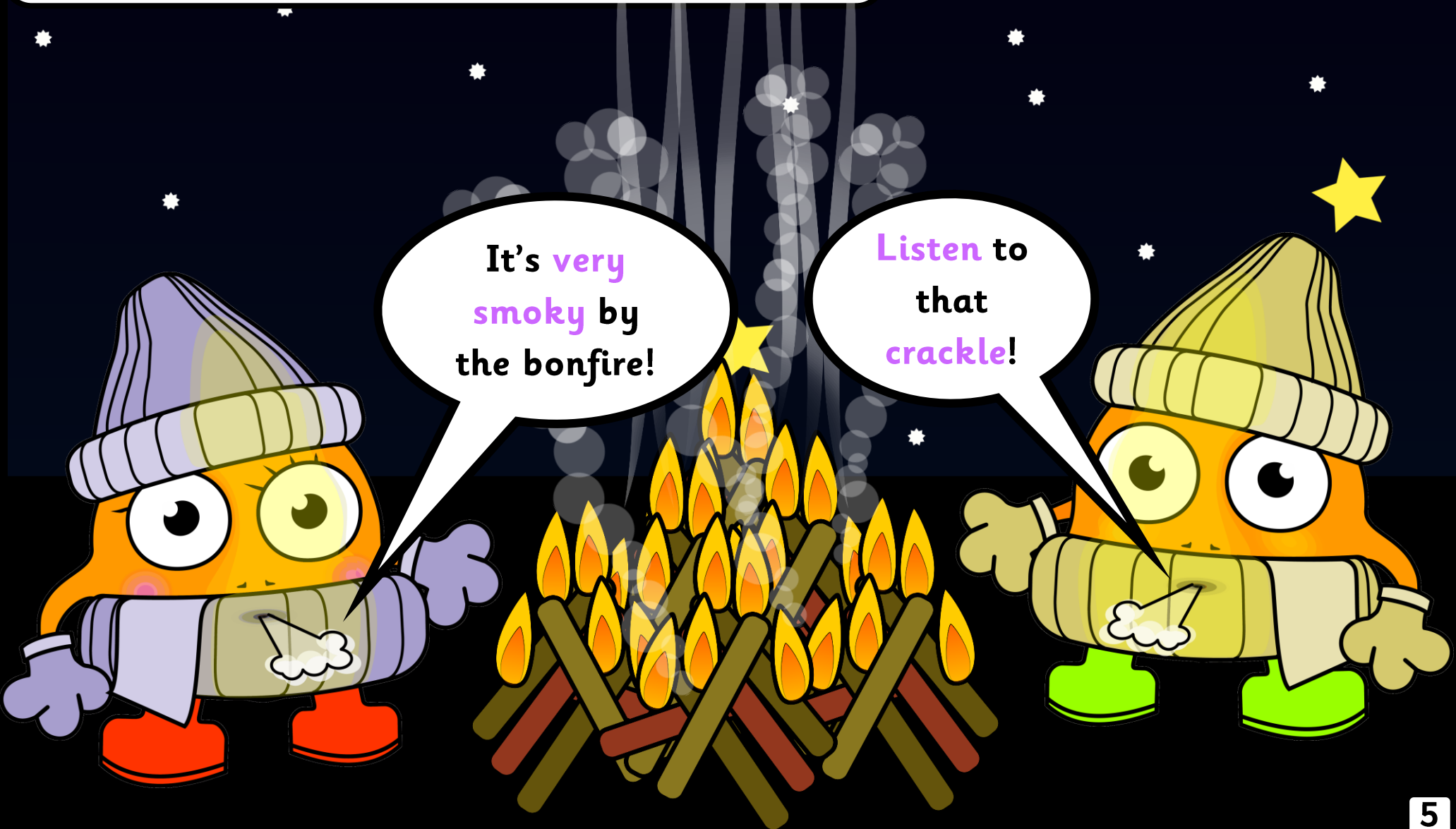


I just need to get **ready**

Sparklers

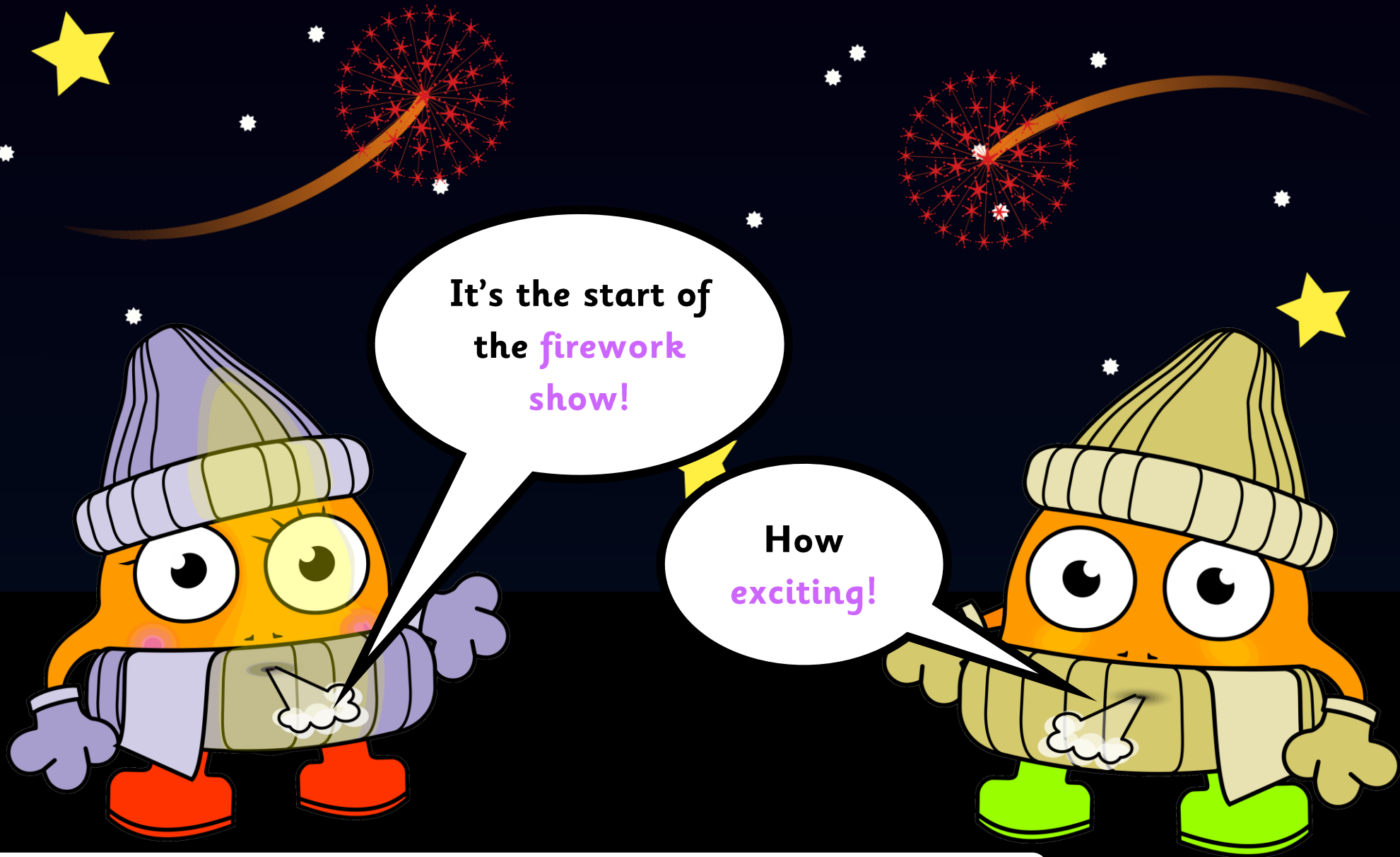
Pap

They **both** enjoy a drink of **warm** hot **chocolate**.

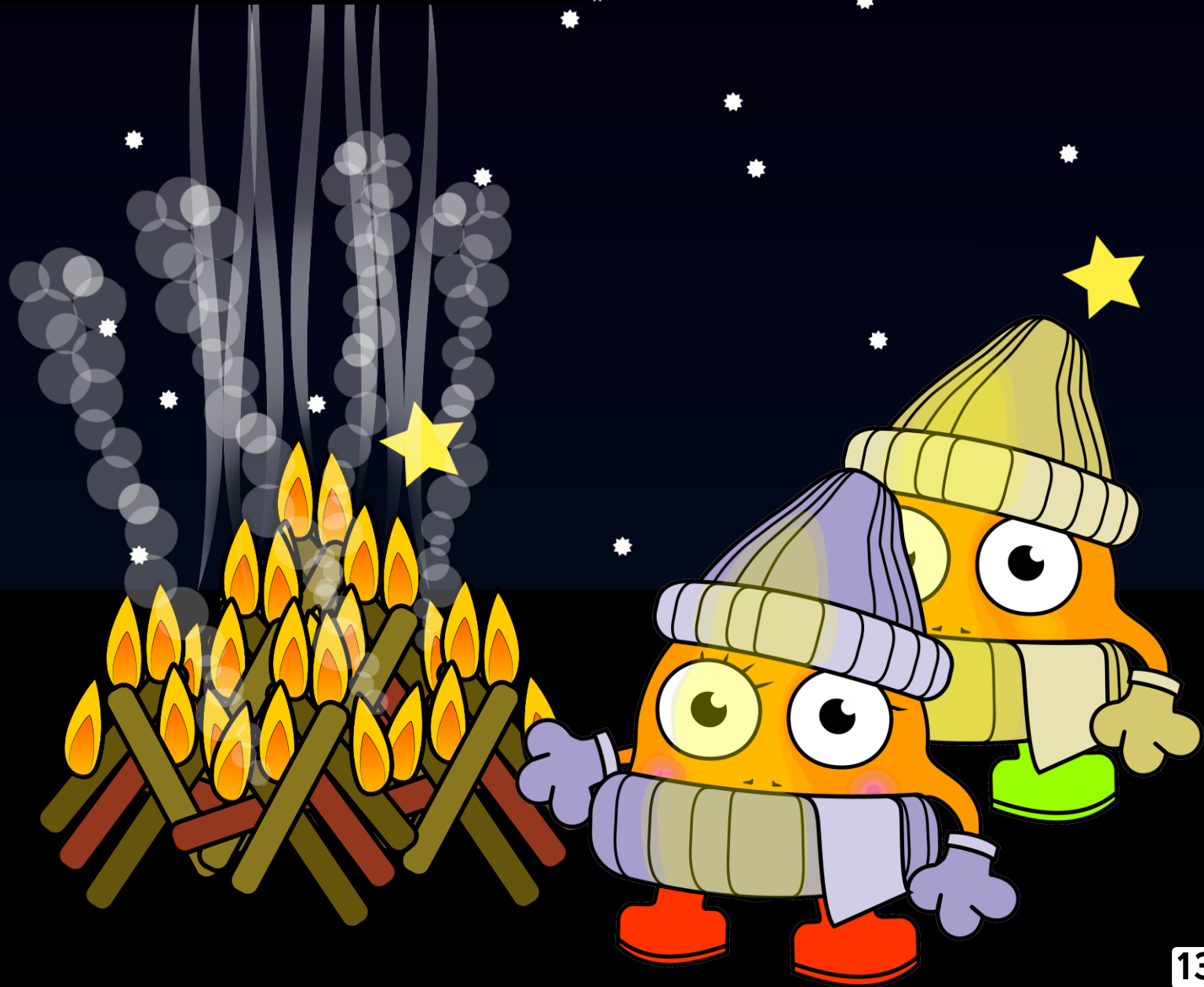
Hot Chocolate and Marshmallows

The twins no longer feel **warm**. It is time to **walk** home.

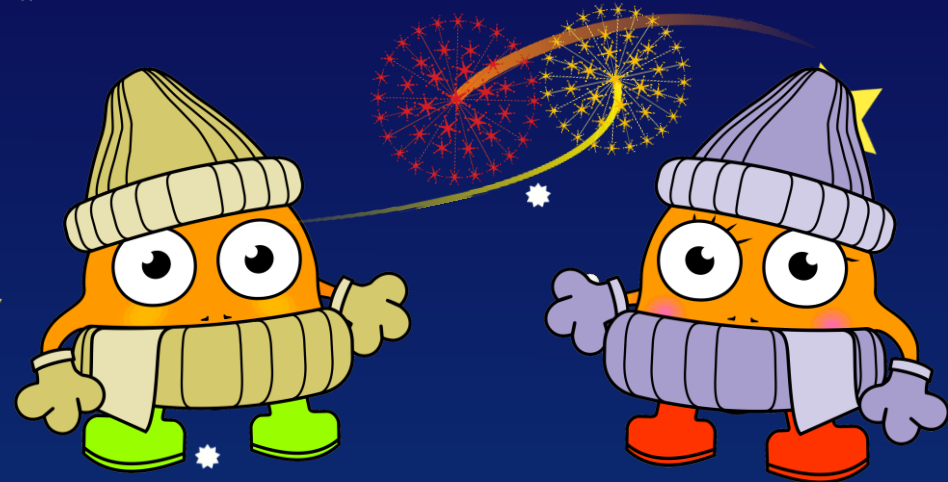


I am a bit
