During Autumn 1, 84% of our children across the school agreed so we decided to do a whole school sample with a Q&A session for children and their teachers. We did this so that all children understand that they have the opportunity to be involved and evaluate collective worship and that they are aware that they all have the right to do so. We decided to do this by discussing ways in which they are or can be involved in Collective Worship. Later within the half term, we reposed the question. We are pleased that our children are secure on ways they can share ideas with our staff and feel confident to do so!

Q) How confident would you feel that the changes or views would be taken into consideration?

'When we suggest ideas they happen but we talk about them first and ask everyone's opinions and if we disagree we discuss why!'

Following discussions this half term, children were invited to share examples and thoughts about collective worship and how confident they were that these ideas would be implemented.



We decided that this half term we wanted to capture, develop and support our children's pastoral well-being and relationship with God. Staff have begun to create suggestions for deeper questions in order to delve into discussions around the children's faith journey's. We hope that we will gain further insight into how we may best support, develop and guide our children's spiritual well-being further over Spring term.



As a team we shared examples of CST principles and reflection in action in RE Pupil Voice order to ensure that our responses and aims were clear.




Children are able to demonstrate examples of how they may put this into action themselves and also create ideas and plans collectively.



Children should be given opportunities to reflect, think deeply and pose questions.

Children consider their own faith journeys and relationship with God. Children should have an opportunity to reflect on this through learning, as well as Collective Worship and conversation with staff.

Children are able to pick apart meanings and messages and interpret them independently.



Children are able to independently and confidently dissect morals and teachings from parables and RE teachings.

Children are able to relate these messages and teachings to other known scriptures. Children will be able to find and share these independently.




'Collective Worship is calm and brings me closer to God. I enjoy when I can come back to something I was doing or thinking about in Collective Worship later on in the week.'







'Collective Worship is about coming together. To bring your true self and share your thoughts and feelings openly with God and your class family.'
