Poetry By Heart

Poetry By Heart is back for 2024! Key Stage 2 pupils will be partaking in a national competition to learn two poems by heart, as part of our oracy and literacy work.

After our successes in the competition last year, where our Poetry Club members were awarded a "Highly Commended" certificate for their group poem, plus Elizabeth (Y6) named 'Best in County', we will be hoping to go one step further and reach the final! Finalists will have the opportunity to perform at the Globe Theatre in London!

We would very much appreciate your support in helping your child to learn their chosen poems at home during our poetry week on 15th January. Parents will then be invited in for a special poetry performance, to see pupils performing their poetry! We welcome year 3 & 4 parents on Tuesday 23rd January & Year 5 & 6 parents on Thursday 25th January.

Spring House Competition

Our House competition this half term will be a "Reading Quiz," designed to celebrate our love for literacy! In the first four weeks of term, pupils will revisit books they have read and enjoyed during their time at OLSJ, in their House Teams. Then, a 'grand final' will be held in Week 5, designed to test the children's knowledge of all they have learned in their house assemblies!

But that isn't all! Eight pupils with exceptional literature and knowledge of children's books and authors will be selected to create two 'super-teams' to partake in the partnership Grand Final - a 'University Challenge' style quiz that will take

place at Mansel Park on 7th February, against other partnership schools. The 'superteams' across the partnership will also be entered into the National Literacy Championships, hosted by the National Literacy Trust. Here, pupils will compete virtually in the South England Regional Heats against schools from across neighbouring counties, with the national final being held in London. Pip and Pap Parent & Pupil Workshops

Following extremely positive parent feedback about last half term's Pip and Pap Phonics Workshops, we will be continuing to run a series of workshops around phonics for all. We have found your feedback extremely valuable and have used this to tailor and adapt our offering for parents and pupils. Following feedback, the overwhelming opinion was that parents' preferential choice would be to attend a workshop in the afternoons with their child, as opposed to another time or through another medium. If you are not available to attend the sessions or to send a representative, you are welcome to ask your child's class teacher for a copy of the questions to match each book or to enquire about the art activity, should you wish to replicate this at home.

Blue Peter Book Club

Our Spring Blue Peter Book Club book will be "Finding Her Feet" by Eve Ainsworth, a story about a shy but talented footballer, who navigates challenging friendships and anxiety at school. Our Reading Ambassadors and Librarians will be reading this story to the rest of the school at lunchtimes.
