## **Target Setting Meetings**

We hope you all had a good summer. As a school we are keen to share as much information with you about your child's learning as possible. In the Autumn Term we would like to share with you your child's learning targets and targets for progress this academic year. We set targets in Autumn Term and then track the children throughout the year to ensure that they are making 'at least good' progress across the whole curriculum.

We send a detailed report for all children in March. This allows a mid-year exploration of progress to be shared with parents as well as any development points for the remainder of the year. We also report on social, emotional development and Foundation Learning. At the end of the year we have a summative pupil progress update including outcomes and attendance. Parents are invited to parent teacher meetings alongside all reporting.

In addition to measuring the breadth of children's progress, teacher discussion will also be around the depth of their learning.

Our target meetings will be held on the following days from 12 - 4:30pm:

Monday 16<sup>th</sup> October – Year 2 Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> October – Year 5 Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> October – Year 6 Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> October – Year 3 & 4 Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October – Year 1
